

Connecting Our Previous Learning

There have been a lot of questions about what we can do in our classrooms. We learned in Module 1 that Learner Variability is the Norm in our classrooms. To best plan for this variability, we learned in Module 2 that we must Begin with a Clear and Rigorous Goal for Student Learning. Our goal for Each and Every Student should remain the same, but the Means or how we get our unique learners to reach their goals Can and Should be Flexible. In module 4, we had the opportunity to explore some Predictable Supports strategies.



A Brief Review of Module 4- Predictable Supports

We learned to make learning accessible to all through intentionally and proactively designing with options for methods and materials.

- We previewed the <u>UDL guidelines</u> and learned that It is critical to remember that they are not meant to be a checklist rather suggestions that can be applied to reduce barriers and maximize learning opportunities for all learners to reach their goals.
- We explored a Predictable Supports Resource that provided design options for removing barriers. These resources reminded us that barriers do not exist within our students rather our lesson design. There were many low and high-tech options provided. If you need a link, <u>here you go!</u>
- Lastly, we discussed that it is critical to guide students through reflections that focus on the options they choose for learning. As facilitators of learning, we need to encourage our students to reflect on whether or not the predictable supports removed a learning barrier.


